





### Cash Management and BLUEcloud Commerce: Installing a Point-of-Sale System in a Multi-branch Public Library

The Jacksonville Public Library conducted a pilot project in 2016 to use the cash management feature and BLUEcloud Commerce for credit card payments in 4 of our 21 libraries. The goal of the project was to reduce transaction errors from the previous system and streamline the process for the circulation staff. ### Symphony API: Daily Reconciliation Process Using Transaction Logs

In 2016, the Technology Services department was tasked with implementing a daily reconciliation procedure that would allow branch managers to reconcile transactions entered into Workflows with transactions entered into the cash registers. 
